

LPISD Academy Back To School Plan for Parents

2020-2021

All information is subject to change. Instructional information is Academy-specific.



STAFF

- Required to self-screen before coming onto campus each day (includes temperature checks).
- Required to report if they have COVID-19 symptoms, are lab-confirmed positive, and/or had close contact with a lab-confirmed individual

PARENTS

- Ensure you do not send a child to school if the child has COVID-19 symptoms or is lab-confirmed with COVID-19. You may opt for remote instruction as feasible.
- May opt for remote instruction if your child has had close contact with an individual who is lab-confirmed.

Face Coverings

Schools are required to follow the governor's executive order regarding guidance on face coverings.

Campus Visitors

- Virtual meetings will be utilized (ARD meetings, parent conferences, etc.)
- Campus visitors must adhere to the district and campus health and safety requirements.
- Campus visitors will be screened prior to allowing entry to the building:
 - Temperature Checks
 - Screening Questionnaire Protocol

Individuals <u>Confirmed</u> or <u>Suspected</u> with COVID-19

 Any individuals who themselves are either lab-confirmed to have COVID-19 or are experiencing the symptoms of COVID-19 must stay at home throughout the infection period and cannot return to campus until ALL 3 re-entry conditions have been met.

- At least 3 days, 72 hours, have passed since recovery (resolution of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications);
- 2. The individual has improvement in symptoms (ex: cough, shortness of breath); and
- 3. At least 10 days have passed since the symptoms first appeared.

Students Displaying COVID-19 Symptoms

- Students displaying symptoms will be sent to the nurse for a clinical assessment to determine if and when a student needs to be sent home.
- Students who are ill will be separated from their peers and must be picked up. District transportation will not be provided.
- Communication will be provided to the parents of students who may have come in contact with a COVID-19 positive student or staff.

Staff Displaying COVID-19 Symptoms

• Staff members displaying symptoms will follow district protocols including isolation from students and other staff members.

Hand Washing/Sanitizing

- Hand sanitizer will be available at the main entry to campus, in common areas throughout the campus, and upon entering classrooms.
- Staff and students are expected to regularly wash and/or sanitize their hands.

- Shared supplies and instructional tools will be limited.
- High-touch areas, working areas, and shared objects will be disinfected regularly.

Disinfecting Protocols

- Each classroom and restroom will be disinfected daily (or more as needed).
- High-touch areas will be disinfected daily.
- Cafeteria will be disinfected throughout the day.

 If a classroom or facility is closed due to COVID-19 spread, a recommended disinfectant will be used.

Classroom Procedures

- Visual reminders of distancing practices and requirements
- Access to hand sanitizer & reminders to wash hands
- Desks/tables socially distanced as much as instructionally possible.
- Limit student transitions within the classroom
- Classroom doors to remain open during transition to minimize contact

Arrival/Dismissal & Transition Procedures

- Strict adherence to designated entrance and exit locations will be followed.
- Dismissal will be staggered.
- When transitioning between classes, students will maximize social distancing requirements.
- If a hallway traffic pattern is implemented, students will be expected to follow that pattern.

Transportation Procedures

- It is highly recommended for parents/guardians to bring their student(s) to school. There will be limited regular seats available.
- Parents MUST sign up for transportation. Once the school year begins, it will take at least a week to add a new rider.
- Parents must screen their children. Face coverings must be worn.
- Students will sit alone in a seat. Family members may sit together.
- Transportation stops will be adjusted to limit the number of stops.

COVID-19 SYMPTOMS

Have you recently begun experiencing any of the following in a way that is not normal for you?

- Feeling feverish or a measured temperature greater than or equal to 100.0 degrees Fahrenheit
- Loss of taste or smell
- Cough
- Difficulty breathing
- Shortness of breath
- Headache

- Chills
- Sore throat
- Shaking or exaggerated shivering
- Significant muscle pain or ache
- Diarrhea

CLOSE CONTACT

- Being directly exposed to infectious secretions (ex: being coughed on while not wearing a mask or face shield); or
- Being within 6 feet for a cumulative duration of 15 minutes, while not wearing a mask or face shield;
- IF either occurred at any time in the last 14 days at the same time the infected individual was infectious.
- Individuals are presumed infectious at least 2 days prior to symptom onset, or, in the case of asymptomatic individuals who are lab-confirmed with COVID-19, 2 days prior to the confirming lab test.

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3 Instructional Delivery Methods

Face-To-Face (F2F)

 Traditional, in-class, physically present instruction

Synchronous

2-way, live, virtual instruction

Asynchronous

Student-owned instruction & learning

Face-To-Face Instructional Delivery (F2F)

**Scheduled to begin September 8th

- "Brick & Mortar" teaching
- Traditional, in-class, physically present instruction
- Must follow district and campus guidelines for health and safety
- District grading policies are in effect
- Attendance policies are in effect



Synchronous Instruction

**Begins August 19th

- 2-way, real-time, virtual instruction through an electronic device
- Must be logged on at official class time
- Attendance taken 10 minutes after class begins
- District grading policies are in effect
- Attendance policies are in effect



Asynchronous Instruction

**Begins August 19th

- "Student Owned & Operated"
- Engaged in learning activities at least 20 hours per week/4 hours per day – any time during the day
- Scheduled opportunities to meet with content and advisory teachers throughout the week
- MS TEAMS curriculum for traditional semester-long classes
- Edgenuity for credit recovery or accelerated initial credit
- District grading policies are in effect
- Attendance requirements are in effect



Additional Information



Student Council and Academy Hour activities can be recorded and posted as much as possible.



Students choosing either of the remote learning options (Synchronous or Asynchronous) may attend Academy Hour/Student Council activities virtually as feasible.



Students that attend classes at LPHS and will need to shuttle may have the option to remain at The Academy and attend their LPHS class synchronously depending on the class.



Certain classes (hands-on CTE classes, Fine Arts, Athletics) will need to be attended in person.

Choose an Instructional Delivery Method

Parents & students will need to choose an instructional delivery method (for 1st 6 weeks = August 4th)

At the end of each 6 weeks, parents & students may choose a different delivery method.
